

Opportunity for start-ups and SMEs: up to €60,000 from the dAIEDGE project, with a deadline of 14 October

Salamanca becomes the epicentre of European technological innovation by hosting the fourth General Assembly of the dAIEDGE project, with the University of Salamanca and the AIR Institute as hosts.

On Monday and Tuesday, Salamanca became the European headquarters of technological innovation with the celebration of the fourth General Assembly of the international dAIEDGE project. The University of Salamanca and the AIR Institute are acting as hosts and key partners in this initiative, consolidating the city's role as a benchmark in the sector.

The event, which is taking place at the historic Colegio Arzobispo Fonseca at the University of Salamanca, brings together a consortium of 36 entities from 15 countries, including universities, research centres and technology companies. The common goal is to propel Europe towards a position of leadership in artificial intelligence at the Edge, strengthening digital sovereignty and economic competitiveness.



Last chance for funding: 600.000€ at stake

Coinciding with the assembly, the project has launched its third and final call for funding, a key opportunity for the innovative ecosystem. The deadline for submitting applications will remain open until 14 October.

In this edition, a total of 10 projects will be selected, each receiving funding of up to €60,000. The beneficiaries will also receive seven months of joint work and advice from specialists at the prestigious German Research Centre for AI. The call is aimed at legal entities, both individually and in consortia of up to two members, ranging from universities to SMEs and start-ups.

Salamanca, a hub for technology

The choice of Salamanca as the venue for this assembly is no coincidence. According to the consortium, it is recognition of the growing role that the University of Salamanca and the local research ecosystem play in innovation and digitalisation at an international level. During these sessions, members will analyse the progress made and discuss the next steps to strengthen the continent's technological competitiveness.

The city's role as a technological meeting point will be further consolidated on Wednesday, 17 September, with the celebration of International Cooperation Day. This event, in which dAIEDGE will also participate alongside the University of Salamanca, seeks to promote collaboration between experts, universities and leading institutions.
